

This work will also drive continued progress across global efforts, including the **Science Summit at UNGA 80, the G20 South African Brain Economy Summit, and DAC Brain House@Davos2026**.

We hope you'll take part in this collective effort to make brain health a lasting global priority—and help shape the decisions and investments that will carry it forward.
